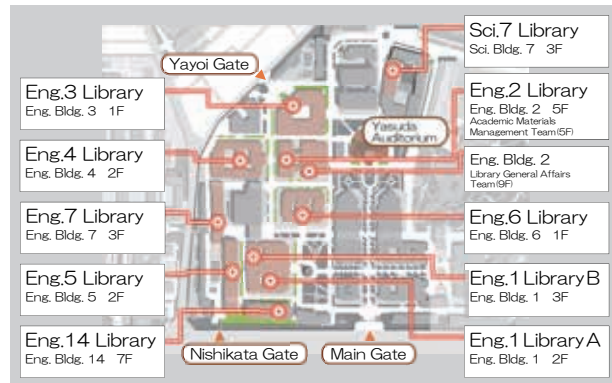
List of Libraries for Engineering and Information Science & Technology

User Registration

You need:	Your IC University ID Card *If you do not have an IC University ID card, please present proof of affiliation and apply for a library card at the Eng. 2 Library
Apply at:	Student: Please register your e-mail address and phone number in the UTAS system. If you cannot log in to UTAS, present your student ID card at the library counter.
Services available	Borrowing, MyOPAC Log-in, entering libraries in UTokyo *When you log in to MyOPAC, you can check reservation status, extend borrowed materials, and use Delivery Request Service.

Borrowing

Books: Up to 5 books for 2 weeks (A loan renewal is allowed four times)

Present your IC University ID card or library card.

■ Photocopying *You must understand copyright law to use copyrighted materials.

- Photocopying (University expense)
 - Prepaid card purchased at university expense
 - University expense application form (公費来館複写申込書)

Please contact your home library in advance.

You need permission from the faculty advisor responsible for the budget.

■ Delivery Request

- Free of charge: Book delivery from On-campus libraries besides your home library
- Fee-based: Request materials from other universities, request photocopies or PDF files from UTokyo libraries

*Paid services require registration at your department library.

For paying by public expense, an application signed and sealed by the faculty advisor responsible for the budget is required.

Please mind your manners.

The following activities are prohibited:

- Eating, drinking, smoking, conversing on mobile phones, and taking pictures inside the library.
- Using an ID or library card that is not your own.
- Loaning borrowed materials to another person.
- Damaging or losing materials.

- Photocopying more than just a small portion of a book.
- Making copies of software.
- Excessive downloading of electronic books and journals, databases, or any content contained therein.
- Transferring, distributing, and/or uploading data from electronic books, journals, and databases.

■ Finding Articles and Reading on the Internet

● TREE (UTokyo Resource Explorer)

Search electronic journals, books, databases, U-Tokyo OPAC, and more.

● Useful Databases

CiNii Research (Academic journals and transactions by academic societies in Japan, etc.)

Web of Science (Covers articles published in major academic journals)

Engineering Village (Covers a wide range of engineering-related fields)

● Literacy

Gateway to search for documents and other academic information over the Internet

■ Getting Articles (Visit the library, Read on the Internet, Request delivery)

● U-Tokyo OPAC

Search by books or journal titles and confirm the holding library.

You can check the location of the holding library, open hours, and other information.

● E-journal & E-book Portal

Search by electronic journals or book titles.

● Ezproxy

Some e-Journals, e-books, and databases may be used from outside of the campus (You will need to have a UTokyo Account/available by position).



● Delivery Services (pick up at your home library)

Book delivery from on-campus libraries besides your home library (free of charge)
Document delivery from UTokyo Libraries (Photocopy/View PDF) [FEE-required]
InterLibrary Loan (Photocopy/Borrow) from other universities [FEE-required]

● MyOPAC

You can request delivery service from the Internet.
Extend return dates for borrowing books, book purchase requests, and more.

■ Wireless LAN

Personal computers can connect to the internet using UTokyo WiFi service in all libraries.

History of Libraries for Engineering and Information Science & Technology

There are two points of origin for the Faculty of Engineering at the University of Tokyo: the Imperial College of Engineering (Koubu daigakkou) and the Department of Science (Technology) at the University of Tokyo, as they were known in the early Meiji era. The engineering library at the Imperial College of Engineering, known as Shobou, and the Library of Law, Science, and Literature at the Department of Science both housed some of the most extensive collections in Japan.

The two faculties merged in 1886 to form the College of Engineering at the Imperial University of Tokyo (Teikoku daigaku kouka daigaku). The College of Engineering branch library, Shobou, was later incorporated into the University Library in 1893. As the collection of material continued to grow thereafter, the College of Engineering (later renamed the Faculty of Engineering in 1919) succeeded in creating new department libraries. Through these a variety of different services were offered.

In April 2006, all of the department libraries were gathered into one organization: the Libraries for Engineering and Information Science & Technology. The previously existing department libraries remained as they were, managed as a single organization. The libraries strive to provide an even more exceptional level of service to the students and faculty of the university. Along with the most current collections in Engineering and Information Science & Technology, the library reflects the Faculty of Engineering's long-standing tradition from early in the Meiji era of collecting dissertations, foreign professorial collections, writings by professors with overseas study experience, picture maps from the Edo period, and other such precious documents.
